## **ABSTRACT**

THE EFFECT OF BENEFICIARY FAMILY PARTICIPATION IN FAMILY CAPABILITIES IMPROVING MEETINGS ON UNDERSTANDING PARENTING PATTERNS (STUDY ON THE PKH GROUP OF NAGARAWANGI VILLAGE, CIHIDEUNG DISTRICT, TASIKMALA CITY). The situation of KPM which has financial limitations requires housewives to work so that they have less time with their children and even parents are less able to manage emotions such as committing physical and psychological violence against children. This is caused by a lack of understanding of good parenting patterns. So, to increase understanding of good parenting patterns from parents, especially KPM, the government encourages KPM to participate in one of the PKH activities, namely the Family Capacity Building Meeting (P2K2). The aim of this research is to analyze the influence of KPM participation in implementing P2K2 on understanding parenting patterns in the PKH Group, Nagarawangi Village. This research uses a quantitative approach with correlational methods. The sampling technique used isprobability sampling using the Slovin formula, to obtain sample results of 100 people. The results of the hypothesis test show the t value<sub>count</sub> the KPM participation variable in P2K2 has a value of 6.811 > t value<sub>table</sub> 1.98447. Meanwhile, the probability value is 0.000 < alpha0.05 (5%) so it can be concluded that  $H_0$  rejected and  $H_1$  accepted. The coefficient value for the independent variable is 0.567, which is positive for the dependent variable, indicating that the higher the KPM's participation in P2K2, the higher the level of understanding of parenting patterns. The contribution of the KPM participation variable to understanding parenting patterns was 32.1%, while 67.9% was the contribution of other variables not included in this research. Also, the correlation results show that KPM participation and understanding of parenting patterns in P2K2 have a moderate relationship. Thus, based on the results of the analysis, it can be concluded that KPM participation in P2K2 has a positive and significant effect on understanding parenting patterns.
