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ABSTRACT

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DESCRIPTION OF FAMILY SUPPORT FOR DRUG REHABILITATION PATIENTS IN PREVENTING RELAPSE (A CASE STUDY OF DRUG REHABILITATION PATIENTS AT THE MUTIARA MAHARANI FOUNDATION IN SOUTH JAKARTA)

Drug abuse remains a threat to society and the government. This problem arises because the rate of drug abuse in Indonesia is still considered very high. Relapse is a behavior of using drugs again after having been clean during rehabilitation. A non-ideal family condition is one of the factors for relapse among drug addicts. This study aims to describe the family support for drug rehabilitation patients in preventing relapse at the Mutiara Maharani Foundation in South Jakarta City using a case study method. There are seven research informants, including one key informant, three main informants, and three supporting informants. Data analysis uses the triangulation technique test. The results of the study indicate that the depiction of family support for drug rehabilitation patients in preventing relapse is divided into four aspects: emotional support, which consists of empathy, attention, and affection; informational support, which consists of advice, suggestions, and information; instrumental support, which consists of labor, funds, and time; and appraisal support, which consists of positive expressions and appreciative attitudes. Future researchers should investigate the obstacles faced by families in providing support to drug rehabilitation patients.
