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ABSTRAK

Penelitian mengenai gestur di berbagai ranah dan jenjang pendidikan telah banyak dilakukan, namun jarang yang menelaah gestur dalam pengajaran dengan menganalisa makna dalam suatu data yang menggunakan mode verbal dan mode gambar. Oleh sebab itu, penelitian ini memaparkan bagaimana seorang guru menyampaikan makna melalui gestur yang dilakukan di dalam kelas. Penelitian ini melibatkan seorang guru Bahasa Inggris. Data diperoleh melalui observasi dan stimulasi ingatan (*Stimulated Recall*) kemudian dianalisis menggunakan sistemik fungsional-analisis wacana multimodal (O'Halloran, 2008) dan teori appraisal (Martin and White, 2005). Hasil analisis data menunjukkan bahwa terdapat tiga cara penyampaian makna yang digunakan oleh seorang guru yang terdiri dari *Engaging the Students' Classroom Activities through Raising and Waving Hands, Emphasizing the Instruction through Raising a hand; Pointing; Shaking a Hand; and Thumb Up*, dan *Natural Movements in The Form of Writing; Coughing; Scratching a Head; and Scratching an Eye during Teaching and Learning Classroom Activities*. Lalu, hasil penelitian menunjukkan bahwa penyampaian makna tersebut dapat memotivasi murid selama proses belajar mengajar di dalam kelas.
