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ABSTRAK

Penelitian ini bertujuan untuk menyelidiki tantangan dan solusi yang dihadapi oleh beberapa dosen selama mengajar bahasa Inggris di kelas EFL dengan masalah kelas besar. Studi kasus deskriptif digunakan sebagai desain penelitian. Penelitian ini melibatkan dua dosen *speaking* yang mengajar kelas *English for Survival* di semester pertama dari Jurusan Pendidikan Bahasa Inggris di salah satu Universitas di Tasikmalaya sebagai peserta penelitian. Mereka telah berpengalaman dalam mengajar *speaking* di kelas besar. Data dikumpulkan melalui wawancara semi-terstruktur dan dianalisis secara tematik. Temuan penelitian ini menggambarkan bahwa ada tiga tantangan utama dengan berbagai solusi selama mengajar berbicara di kelas besar. Pertama, terkait dengan keterlibatan siswa secara perilaku menggunakan *peer up* dan praktek, dan simulasi. Kedua, terkait dengan pemilihan metode pengajaran terbaik yang harus disesuaikan dengan kebutuhan dan kondisi siswa sebagai kegiatan *roleplay*. Yang terakhir, berkaitan dengan menangani manajemen kelas yang memiliki tiga sub tema diantaranya tantangan yang dihadapi dalam mengingat nama seluruh mahasiswa dengan menggunakan *warming up* dan mengecek kehadiran, mengatasi ukuran kelas yang kurang memadai dengan menggunakan pengaturan tempat duduk, dan mengatur penilaian dan waktu umpan balik dapat menggunakan *peer reflection and feedback*. Penelitian ini diharapkan dapat menjadi *role model* bagi para guru atau dosen yang menghadapi tantangan yang sama dalam mengajar *speaking* di kelas besar, dan mereka dapat mencoba menyelesaikan rintangan tersebut dengan menggunakan kegiatan simulasi (*roleplay*), pengaturan tempat duduk, absensi rutin, dan *peer reflection and feedback*.

ABSTRACT

This study aimed at investigating the challenges and solutions faced by the lecturers during teaching English speaking in the EFL classroom with the large class size issue. A descriptive case study was used as the research design. This study involved two speaking lecturers who teach English for Survival class in the 1st semester from English Education Department of one university in Tasikmalaya as research participants. They have experienced in teaching a large speaking class. The data were collected through a semi-structured interview and analyzed thematically. The findings of this study described that there were three main challenges with various solutions during teaching speaking in large classes. First, dealing with students’ behavioral engagement using peer up and practice, and simulation. Second, related to choosing the best teaching methods that should be adjusted to the students’ needs and conditions as a roleplay activity. The last, dealing with classroom management which has three sub-themes as faced challenges in remembering students’ names by using warming up and taking a roll call, dealing with insufficient classroom space by using a seating arrangement, and organizing assessment and feedback time can use a peer feedback and peer assessment. This research is expected to be a role model for teachers or lecturers who face the same challenges in teaching speaking in a large class, and they can try to solve those obstacles by using simulation activity or roleplay, seating arrangement, regular roll call, and peer reflection and feedback
