CHAPTER III

RESEARCH PROCEDURES

A. Research Method

The research method in this present study is case study. A case study is a type of research methodology that enables the use of many data sources to explore a phenomenon in its context. Case study research is defined as. According to Yin (1994) in Jennifer Rowley, a case study is one that: A case study is an empirical investigation that: Examines a current occurrence in the context of actual life, especially when the distinctions between the phenomenon and the setting are not immediately apparent. Since "how" and "why" questions are most likely to be appropriate for the case study technique, it is your initial responsibility to establish the nature of your research questions in this regard. This research method is used by the researcher to observe the changing of EFL young learner's vocabulary through video song. In this fieldwork, the researcher also plays as a teacher and researcher.

B. Participant of the Research

The participants in the study are the 11 years old young learners from an elementary school located in Tasikmalaya, west Java. He is the student 5th grade in *SD IT AL-MISBAH*. The child had been learning English for 2 years in formal education. However, he has low capability in vocabulary. In the first meeting he didn't know how to greeting in English. He also has difficulties remembering the vocabulary meaning of the words and the way how to pronounce them correctly. The researcher chose him as the participant of this research based on the problem encountered by the student.

C. Procedure of the Research

As a whole, the researcher and the participant go through the following stages:

Table 3.1 : Stages of Learning Activity Using A Song :

Stages	Details
1. Set the context	Build up the environment by explaining the purpose, background, information
2. Pre-teach	Anny necessary vocabulary, using visual aids, action; reality,etc
3. Play on cassette or sing	To allow children to listen, show understanding, familiarize themselves with the rhythm, tune, etc
4. Do further listening activities	Like matching, coloring, filling in gaps, etc
5. Work on pronunciation awareness	Song provide a good model
6. Invite children to listen, repeat, and practice by joining in and learning to sing	Encourage children to use actions, mime, drama,gesture, etc. They will help the children memorize the words and their meanings.
7. Give a written record of text along activities	It is better to avoid giving the script the first time introducing the song, since it is easier for the children to listen first than

D. Techniques of Collecting the Data

In this research I use two ways to collect the data. The first is by doing an observation and the second one is through the students' work. Observation is used to obtain the data through observing the teaching learning process. Furthermore, an observation guide is used as the instrument of the observation. Meanwhile, Student's work is used to collect factual data from the student itself. Student's worksheet is an instrument of student's work.

E. Techniques of Analyzing the Data

This research uses thematic analysis for analyzing the data (Braun, Clarke & Terry, 2014) These are the following stages:

1. Familiarizing the data

In this process the researcher watches the video data, reads the transcripts of that, and re-reads them more than once and also writes some notes from it.

2. Generating initial codes

The researcher makes the sign in codes occurring in the data related to the purpose of current study (Find out the theme that occurs while learning English by using English video songs in EYL classroom) by highlighting the codes.
