Social skills are an ability to adjust to social demands that exist in the environment, the adverse effects caused if adolescents do not have good social skills, one of which is juvenile delinquency. One of the efforts to prevent this is for the government creates a program where adolescents can develop their interests and social skills. The program implemented is the Forum GenRe Program in Ciamis Regency. Through the Forum GenRe program, it is expected that teenagers will be active in every activity so that they can develop their social skills. The purpose of this study was to analyze and obtain data related to de relationship between adolescent activeness in the Forum GenRe program with the improvement of social skills studies in adolescents in the Ciamis regency Forum GenRe program. The method used in this study uses a quantitative correlational approach. The sampling technique uses a saturated sampling technique, which takes the entire population with 54 people. The analysis method is by conducting a correlation test. Study's results were based on a hypothesis test obtained from a Pearson correlation value of 0.945 which showed a solid, a powerful relationship with positive relationship between adolescent activeness variables (X) with social skills variables (Y). The strong relationship between the two variables seen from the level of adolescent activity is in the high category with a percentage of 63% and the level of social skills is in the high category with a percentage of 55.6%. Thus, it can be concluded that H_1 is fulfilled, namely the existence of a positive and significant relationship between adolescent activeness in programs with improved social skills. In addition, there is an influence on adolescent activeness in the gender forum program, a level of social skills of 89%, while the rest is the contribution of other variables that are not included in this research model.
