Poverty can occur of them because there is no will to increase the creativity or potential of the community. As a result, many people are still living in poverty. One effort to overcome poverty is empowerment through training. The training provided aims to increase the creativity and potential of the community which, when connected with poverty, is closely related to an effort to escape the poverty gap. This study aims to determine the process and impact of the hydroponic training program on PKH beneficiary families in Darmacaang Village, Cikoneng District, Ciamis Regency. The research method in this study uses descriptive qualitative methods. Data collection is done by observation, interviews, and documentation. The results showed that the process of implementing the hydroponic training program was carried out through several stages including the planning stage, the implementation stage, and the evaluation stage. Apart from obtaining results in the form of knowledge and skills from the implemented program, this hydroponic training also has several positive impacts on PKH beneficiary families including impacts on economic aspects, impacts on the environment, impacts on health, impacts on social aspects, and impacts on relationships in the village. The Darmacaang Village Government is interested and will adopt hydroponic training as an empowerment program budgeted for by village funds. The process of implementing the hydroponic training program is carried out through several stages including the planning stage which includes identifying needs, processing data, preparing training programs, funding or financing, and determining program goals and indicators of achievement. Furthermore, the implementation phase includes materials, methods, media, and community participation in training. And the last stage is the evaluation stage of the training program. This hydroponic training program also provided positive results and impacts for PKH beneficiary families as well a follow-up from the village government.
