This study aims to analyze the collaboration carried out by pentahelix actors in the Development of Smart Fisheries Village (SFV) Tourism Village, Kampung Nila in Kawali Village, Ciamis Regency. This study examines two main problem formulations, namely how the collaboration carried out by pentahelix actors in the development of Smart Fisheries Village (SFV) tourism village, Kampung Nila in Kawali Village and the driving and inhibiting factors of collaboration in the development. The purpose of this study is to analyze how the collaboration process in the development of tourism villages and identify the supporting and inhibiting factors in SFV Kampung Nila, Kawali Village, Kawali District, Ciamis Regency. This study uses the theory of collaborative governance with a pentahelix collaboration model that includes collaboration between government, academics, private sector, community, and media to analyze the dynamics of collaboration that occurs. The pentahelix collaboration model functions to strengthen interaction and synergy between various actors in the context of developing tourism villages. This study uses a qualitative research method with a case study approach. The results of the study show that the collaboration went well and in accordance with the principles of collaborative governance as stated by Ansell and Gash. The initial condition of the actors already had a previous working relationship. The institutional design is characterized by the existence of mutually agreed basic rules, namely the change of management every 2 years. Facilitative leadership to empower all actors. This collaboration is reflected through inclusive face-to-face dialogue forums, such as hamlet and village deliberations. Pentahelix actors demonstrate a high level of trust in each other, build a shared commitment, and have a shared understanding of the main objectives of the program, namely to improve community welfare, strengthen the local economy, and empower communities sustainably.
