Expansion is one way that can be done in an effort to increase regional economic development and community welfare. However, its implementation must be monitored and supervised continuously so that it is in accordance with the initial objectives of the expansion. The aim of this research is to analyze the impact of regional expansion on the regional economic performance index and its influence on the Gini ratio and human development index in Ciamis Regency and Pangandaran Regency. This research uses a quantitative method, the location of this research is Ciamis Regency and Pangandaran Regency, West Java Province. Data collection techniques use library research and documentation from related parties.

Based on the research results, it can be concluded that the economic performance index of Ciamis Regency after expansion is better than the economic performance index of Ciamis Regency before expansion, the economic performance index of Ciamis Regency after expansion and Pangandaran Regency

is neither better nor worse or in the same conditions, the economic performance index Ciamis Regency after expansion does not affect the Gini ratio of Ciamis Regency after expansion, the economic performance index of Ciamis Regency after expansion affects the human development index of Ciamis Regency after expansion, the economic performance index of Pangandaran Regency does not affect the Gini ratio of Pangandaran Regency, the economic performance index of Pangandaran Regency does not affect the human development index of Pangandaran Regency. The regional expansion that occurred in Ciamis Regency which created Pangandaran Regency has basically not been able to show results in a better direction in terms of increasing economic development and community welfare for the two regencies.
